




Road Trippin' in Colorado

Steamboat Springs to Arapahoe Basin Ski Resort

(103 miles/165 km)

Stage 2 begins in Steamboat Springs, travels across a diverse landscape of forests, arid sagebrush and sand dunes and high alpine mountains.

The [Kremmling Recreation Area](#) features sand-dune riding and primitive camping. Visitors enjoy off-road vehicle riding across 300 acres/121 hectares of the only OHV sand recreation area in Colorado. A stop at [Green Mountain Reservoir](#) welcomes visitors with a swim beach, more than 200 campsites, and plenty of fishing and boating opportunities.
